TRANSFER ADMISSION GUIDELINES

Admission as a transfer student is based on consistent academic performance at all current and previously attended institutions. MSU performs a holistic review of each applicant. A cumulative grade point average is calculated from all courses completed and attempted.

Students who complete the following at least one full semester (16 weeks) before their desired term of enrollment will be considered more competitive in the admissions process:

- 24 or more credits transferable to MSU
- 2.5 cumulative GPA or higher, with consistent grade performance

SELECTING YOUR MAJOR

When applying, students must select their desired major(s). Some majors at MSU have additional admission requirements (these are called "restricted majors"). If you select a restricted major on your application, you will be asked to provide up to two additional major choices. One of your choices must be a non-restricted major. Students with 42 or more credits transferable to MSU should not select Exploratory Preference as a major.

Applicants to restricted major programs should carefully review these requirements before applying. For more detailed information about restricted programs, including requirements and deadlines, visit go.msu.edu/restricted-majors.

TRANSFERRING CREDITS

Transfer students are encouraged to use the TransferMSU searchable credit

equivalency website, available at **transfer.msu.edu**, to identify courses that may transfer.

Students may transfer a maximum of 60 credits from two-year institutions. Credits may be earned and transferred to MSU at any time during the degree. Students with credits from a 4-year college/university may apply up to 90 eligible credits toward degree requirements. Students are required to complete a minimum of one year's work (at least 30 credits) at Michigan State University in order to be eligible for a degree. Only course work assigned a passing grade of 2.0 or higher will be transferable.

FINANCIAL AID

United States citizens and permanent residents who wish to apply for need-based financial aid, such as the Pell Grant and College Work Study Program, should complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). For more information, visit **finaid.msu.edu**.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Admitted transfer students with 28 or more transferable credits (starting the fall after high school graduation) are eligible to be considered for scholarships. Please visit **go.msu.edu/transferscholarships** for more information.

APPLICATION CHECKLIST

- ☐ Complete MSU's application for admission, including the required essay, online at **go.msu.edu/transfer-apply-now**.
- ☐ Pay the \$65 nonrefundable application fee.
- ☐ Have your official college-level transcript(s) sent directly from each school or institution attended to MSU. This includes transcripts from any dual enrollment or early/middle college programs. These can be sent through online services or by U.S. mail (admissions.msu.edu/contact-us).
- ☐ Send an official copy of score results to the Office of Admissions if you have taken an Advanced Placement (AP), College-Level Examination Program (CLEP), A-Level or International Baccalaureate (IB) exam.

While the Office of Admission may delay a decision until 24 credits transferable to MSU are completed, you can provide the following items for consideration and an earlier decision.

- ☐ Final official high school transcript(s) sent electronically to MSU directly from your high school through an electronic delivery service.
- ☐ MSU is test-optional for the ACT/SAT through 2026 and not required for consideration. Transfer applicants who would like to have test scores considered will have the ability to self-report scores on the application. Admitted students who chose to apply with self-reported test scores will be required to provide official test results to the university before they attend New Student Orientation.
