There are many paths to become a Boilermaker. Take the next steps toward completing your degree by transferring to Purdue. Follow these helpful tips and guidelines to make the transition seamless.

Am I considered a transfer student?

If you have taken 12 or more credit hours of college-level coursework after high school graduation, you should plan to apply as a transfer student. Dual-credit courses taken in high school do not count towards that 12 hour total.

How do I know what to choose for a major?

With over 200 majors, across 11 colleges, take some time to explore our majors at purdue.link/ug-majors. At Purdue, students are **directly admitted to a specific major**.

You will need to decide which program you wish to gain admission to before starting the transfer process, as well as understand the minimum requirements/expectations for your major of choice. Please note that not all of our majors are open to transfer students. **For a current list of closed programs, visit: purdue.link/closed-programs.**

TRANSFER ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

Minimum High School Requirements

- To be eligible for admission, all incoming students must have completed our minimum high school course requirements. **Learn more:** purdue.link/hs-courses
- You can make up for high school course deficiencies with college-level coursework.
 - 1 semester of 100-level college coursework = 2 semesters of high school coursework.

Minimum College Credit Hours & Coursework

- You must complete 12 credit hours of college-level coursework (taken after high school) before you can apply to transfer.
- The Admissions Committee may need the final grades of current coursework to make a final decision — especially if that current coursework/grade is a minimum requirement for your major.

English Proficiency

- Citizens of non-English-speaking countries are required to submit proof of English proficiency to complete their Purdue application.



Does Purdue have transfer agreements with other institutions?

Yes! Purdue has agreements with other institutions to form pathways for students to transfer or transfer credit to Purdue. In addition to meeting any criteria listed in the agreement, students must meet Purdue's transfer criteria for their desired major. **Learn more at:** purdue.link/tsap

How will my credits transfer to Purdue?

Generally, college-level coursework, completed at a regionally accredited institution will transfer. You can **use the Transfer Credit Course Equivalency guide** to find specific Purdue course equivalencies. Upon admission, you will receive a formal transfer credit report and will then work with your academic advisor to determine how each of the courses will best fit into your plan of study.

Important dates and deadlines:

Plan to apply the semester before desired transfer term.
